This report analyses information gathered from 45 European-based foundations working in the field of HIV/AIDS and reveals a number of interesting findings, makes recommendations and highlights current funding trends. The report goes on to make recommendations on what still needs to be done, in order to compile a comprehensive picture of the state of HIV/AIDS funding beyond the realm of European philanthropy.

This report examines US federal funding to address the global HIV/AIDS epidemic in low- and middle-income countries. The data on US international aid for HIV/AIDS is broken down into bilateral and multilateral assistance programmes. Five federal departments and US-funded multilateral organisations are analysed regarding financial support for HIV/AIDS-related activities.

Out of the shadows : HIV/AIDS in Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda: a guide for donors and funders. - Brussels : Kind Baudouin Foundation, 2005. - 64 p.

The report provides guidance to donors funding projects to help those affected by HIV/AIDS in those countries. It highlights the extent of the pandemic, resulting needs, types of responses and the outcomes of interventions carried out by a wide spectrum of donors, including private individuals, companies and grantmakers. The report is a useful resource for newcomers to the subject as well as for experienced funders, which can treat the guide as a starting point for debate and further research.

This report warns of the danger of HIV epidemic escalation in the Russian Federation as a consequence of Russian government policies. Through repression of injecting drug users and stigmatising of HIV-positive people, Russia seems to have systematically rejected well established lessons. The investigations were conducted in Saint Petersburg, the second largest Russian city.

Research findings are divided into four parts: European foundations and corporate funders, European NGOs with an international focus, governmental agencies, and European Commission directorates and agencies. This report of the U.S. -Russia Working Group Against HIV/AIDS is the first publication from a strategic partnership between Russia and the United States to lead and execute collaborative work in the global fight against HIV/AIDS. The report details the status of the epidemic in Russia and presents the policies and the legislation it implies; it also includes recommendations for managing prevention and treatment.

A report on the workshop on traditional medicine and HIV/AIDS. It included a three-day gathering at Brackenhurst Conference Centre (Nairobi), which was an opportunity for traditional healers to share their experiences with AIDS on their own terms and in their own ways. Over the following days, the 13th International Conference on AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Diseases in Africa took place, also in Nairobi and research on herbal medicines, efficacy of treatments, and availability of information and care were discussed.

This report presents available data on the financial aid currently directed towards the HIV/AIDS epidemic in low- and middle-income countries. Estimates of current need are compared with estimates of current funding. Tables and charts display data on HIV/AIDS-

channelled resources from donor governments, multilateral organisations, and the private sector, and domestic funding by the governments of aid-receiving countries.

Global mobilization for HIV prevention : a blueprint for action. - Seattle : Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, 2002. - 30 p.

The world knows much about how to prevent HIV transmission, and both developed and developing countries have demonstrated that existing prevention strategies can have a major impact. This first report of the Global HIV Prevention Working Group, convened by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation, provides a road map for rapidly scaling up prevention programmes to contain and ultimately reverse the AIDS epidemic. The report reviews the scientific literature on the effectiveness of HIV prevention interventions, identifies obstacles to quickly expanding prevention programmes and makes specific recommendations to prevent millions of infections this decade.

This report was issued by Funders Concerned About AIDS (FCAA) and is the outcome of a research project designed to gather information enabling FCAA to further philanthropic initiatives on HIV/AIDS into the 21st century. For this purpose, 35 main HIV/AIDS funders were interviewed in-depth. Findings are described, along with statistical data and illustrative quotes, and conclusions on fostering HIV/AIDS grantmaking are drawn. An appendix on HIV/AIDS resources is also included.
